## MNPS COVID Protocols for the Start of 2021-2022 School Year

#### • School Nurses:

- The role of the nurse will remain the same for 2021-22.
  - Contact tracing and initial investigations will be conducted by school nurses for all schools.
  - Logging in the District COVID tracking system
  - MPHD will continue receiving this information.
- \*\*NEW: Nurses will test students and employees.
  - Rapid, antigen test will be utilized.
  - Testing consent for employees and students will be required.

#### Close Contacts:

- Definition:
  - Traditionally defined as someone within 6 feet of an infected person for more than 15 minutes over 24-hour period.
- \*\*NEW: In the K-12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition now excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of infected students if both were wearing a mask.
- \*\*NEW: Students or staff who are fully vaccinated are not required to quarantine if no symptoms are present.
- \*\*NEW: Division of Schools updated distance learning guidelines for quarantined/self-isolating students based on TDOE guidelines.

# • COVID Isolation Room:

- Each school should designate a local for the isolation room
- The school nurse's clinic should not be utilized for this purpose.

#### Mitigation Strategies:

- Mask:
  - \*\*NEW: Effective August 1, 2021, masks are highly encouraged but not required.
  - Schools should continue to encourage proper mask wearing techniques.
  - Students or staff who are not fully vaccinated, especially those who have underlying medical conditions, are strongly recommended to wear masks for their safety and protection.

- Masks will continue to be made available to students and staff who need or want them.
- Current CDC guidance is that individuals who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks indoors or outdoors.
- All students who are 12 and older have been eligible to be fully vaccinated through public and private sources, and vaccine trials are still ongoing for children aged 5-12 and younger.
- Students under 12 not currently eligible for the vaccine are strongly recommended to wear masks.
- MNPS will continue to monitor community transmission rates as well as COVID cases in our schools to determine whether mandatory mask requirements are necessary.
- o Temperature Screenings and Infrared Cameras in schools, support hub, etc.
  - \*\*NEW: Infrared cameras and temperature screenings are no longer required upon entry.
  - Schools may utilize the infrared cameras to screen students if hotspots emerge.

## Social Distancing:

- \*\*NEW: CDC guidance looks at 3 feet as a good standard in schools.
- Classrooms and desks should be oriented to maximize distance or create smaller group clusters to reduce possible close contacts.
- Schools should continue to find opportunities to encourage and promote social distancing whenever possible.
- Social distancing is an important strategy in reducing potential transmission.
- Reduces chances of close contact quarantines.
- Social distancing of 6 feet of distance will not be feasible in most circumstances.
- Schools should consider the ability to social distance when organizing large gatherings indoors, during lunch, or other activities that would bring together large groups of students.
- Clustering of students into homerooms or other groupings that would make contact tracing more feasible are good strategies to prevent the spread of COVID or larger quarantines.

#### Signage:

\*\*NEW: Updated COVID signage should be posted throughout the building.

- Cleaning:
  - MNPS will clean facilities under normal operating procedures.

#### Water fountains:

- \*\*NEW: Water fountains and bottle filling stations will be operational.
- o MNPS Maintenance will flush and test water fountains prior to use.

### • Notification Letters:

 Notifications will continue to be sent home by schools when a positive case is confirmed in the building, an individual is determined to be a close contact, and all confirmed positive individuals.

# • Transportation:

- Mask will be encouraged but not required.
- Bus drivers are encouraged to keep the windows down transporting students to help circulate the air.
- School Events and Extra Curricular:
  - \*\*NEW: Outdoor events are preferred.
    - All events should be held outside to the extent possible.
    - Social distancing (at least 3 feet) should be encouraged.
  - o \*\*NEW: Indoor Events are permissible.
    - Mask are encouraged but optional.
    - Social distancing should be encouraged.
  - \*\*NEW: Sports/Choral/Theater Arts are permissible.
    - Masks and social distancing are encouraged for all indoor events.
    - Coaches and teachers should be mindful of social distancing during indoor activities such as performance practice, weightlifting, transporting.
    - Avoid team members exposing each other. Exposure is most likely to occur while with individuals own team and not in the actual game against the opponent.

#### Visitors:

- \*\*NEW: Limit guest and volunteers to educational purposes only.
  - Examples include:
    - Mentorship
    - Tutoring
    - Classroom support
    - Advisors
- o Facilities use by third parties are allowed when students are not in classes.
- Mask wearing is encouraged.

# • COVID Testing:

- \*\*NEW: School nurses will be able to conduct COVID rapid tests on as-needed basis for students and staff.
- o Student permission forms are included in the Student-Parent Handbook.
- o Employee permission forms are given by the school nurse.
- o Random testing not recommended at this time but can re-assess as needed.
- o Any use of outside vendor would require an RFP process.
